





#### **President's Letter**







#### Our Mission

To prevent child trafficking, reduce child slavery, and promote children's rights.

#### The Issue

Currently, an estimated 40.3 million people are being trafficked with an estimated 24.9 million of those in forced labour! It is estimated that 1 in 4 vicitims of human trafficking are children under the age of 18. In Ghana, 133,000 people are currently the victims of human trafficking and of those 20,000 are children in forced labour on Lake Volta.





#### Who We Are

Challenging Heights is a non-profit, nongovernmental organisation in Ghana that works to protect children's rights and end child trafficking. Founded by James Kofi Annan in 2005, our main efforts focus on addressing trafficking of children to Lake Volta, where they are forced to work in the fishing industry. We work in underserved coastal communities in Ghana, providing support to women and children in hard-toreach areas that are at risk of child trafficking.


## 2018 In Review

#### Rescue & Recovery

We rescue children in forced labour and offer a holistic programme of rehabilitation and reintegration. With support from the Hovde Foundation, we built the Challenging Heights Hovde House, a rehabilitation centre, that provides continuous survivor care. Also, we work with communities to help survivors and other children to live in freedom. As part of this, we train Community Child Protection Committees in child protection.



#### **Prevention**


We have identified a number of the root causes for child trafficking in the source communities where we work and are addressing them through community engagement through a variety of programmes. The key root causes that we've identified are poverty, naivety, and family separation. Through economic empowerment programmes for women and youth we are addressing poverty. We're tackling naivety through community sensitisation and awareness campaigns. Our presence in the community through Community Child Protection Committees and Alternative Dispute Resolution gives people a chance to address family disputes and prevent trafficking.

#### Advocacy

We are vocal advocates of human rights and engage with governments, civil society organisations, media and other stakeholders to protect them. A participatory and integrated approach to decision making is important to us when it comes to children's needs. Assessing the impact of social and economic policies on women and children at the local, national and international level is central to this. We campaign for children's rights and seek to promote the prosecution of traffickers.



Meet K! He is approximated to be 15 to 16 years old and arriyed at our shelter on the most recent réscue. He was sold in the Ivory Coast along with his brother and has been trafficked throughout West Africa. Two years ago Challenging Heights rescued K's brother off from Lake Volta, his brother told the staff at Challenging Heights that he had been sold with his brother and was persistent to remind us. After 2 years of hoping to find K and reunite the brothers, K is at the Challenging Heights Hovde House Shelter! When K came to the shelter initially, he was shy and reserved, would often sleep in class, and talked about going back to the lake and of the promise his trafficker made to him to give him a room in a house on the lake after he turned 18. K is now doing better and since meeting with his brother on Family Day, understands that he has the opportunity to attain so much more than what his slave master promised him. K is achieving so much! He now know's his ABC's,123's, can do basic addition and subtraction, has stopped sleeping in class and has improved in his handwriting! He has even tested into KG 2! K is also the president of the Child Counselors Programme! We are all so proud of K (and all of our kids) for making such great strides!







Meet Emmanuel, he graduated from our YEP skills training in August 2018 with a certificate in Mobile Phone Repair! In November 2018, Emmanuel was able to open his very own shop to service phones here in Winneba! Emmanuel says he's able to make between 50-100 GHC doing repairs per week but hopes to increase sales. He says the most challenging part of his work is that he lacked accessories to fix some phones and must go to town to get them.
